SPECIAL FEATURE: THE CRA'S IT APPRENTICE PROGRAM

Thank you to the Canada Revenue Agency (CRA) and its Information Technology Branch for this thorough discussion of its IT Apprenticeship Program.

The CRA's Information Technology Branch (ITB) is one of the largest federal public service employers of those in the Computer Systems (CS) field, with over 4,000 CS employees. To keep pace with the ever-changing technological landscape, their Information Technology Apprenticeship Program (ITAP) offers an innovative way of recruiting and retaining top talent.

First implemented in 2009, and revised in September 2020, the ITAP targets post-secondary students as well as individuals who meet the CRA's CS Education Standard. Put simply, it is a structured developmental program that aims to attract new recruits as well as develop employees from the CS-01 to the CS-02 level.

Once in the ITAP, apprentices familiarize themselves with the CRA, complete training activities and work closely with an assigned mentor. Within the first 8 months, the supervisor completes two checkpoints and discusses them with the apprentice. Near the 12-month mark, the supervisor completes a final evaluation of the mandatory requirements for promotion. Pending a successful evaluation, the apprentice is promoted to a CS-02 position within ITB. Apprentices who fail to meet the mandatory requirements for promotion within the established timeline are addressed on a case-by-case basis.

Through the ITAP, the CRA has hired more than 650 skilled individuals since 2018, and fostered countless positive connections between colleagues. Looking forward, the ITAP will continue to evolve alongside the federal public service as it shifts to a new way of working.
