- Identify the general intent of your session (i.e. convey best practices, provide a case study, identify lessons learned, etc.)
- If you have presented at PDW in the past please indicate the year(s) on the template
- Sessions may be delivered in either English or French. ***The proposal should be written in the same language as the proposed session language.***

### **Important Dates**

The submission deadline is **August 13<sup>th</sup>, 2021**. The Program Committee’s goal is to complete the selection process by September 2021 and have the program for PDW 2022 finalized (including session summaries and speaker bio’s) by end of October 2021 for publication on DPI’s web site.
